1. CALL TO ORDER:

President Vogel called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. and verified attendance via roll call. Board member Ottesen led the Pledge of Allegiance.

- 11. ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA: There were no additions to the agenda.
- III. COMMENTS: There were no comments from the audience, via email, or via telephone.

IV. PUBLIC HEARING:

1. 2020 - 2021 Budget: President Vogel opened the public hearing to discuss and receive input from the public regarding the proposed 2020 - 2021 budget for the San Joaquin County Office of Education (SJCOE). Deputy Superintendent Scott Anderson explained that the budget is built on the May revise, which proposes dramatic cuts, but SJCOE continues to maintain a sound financial position and the multi-year projections, which assume 0 percent COLA's in 2021 - 2022 and 2022 - 2023, indicate SJCOE will remain financially healthy throughout that period of time.

Mr. Anderson reviewed the ending balance analysis of all funds, which indicate healthy projected balances on both the restricted and unrestricted sides of the general fund with minor deficit spending attributed to one-time expenses for budgeted construction projects, deferred maintenance projects, and contracted services awaiting payment. Mr. Anderson pointed out the 12.1 percent general fund reserves, adding that program budgets have reserves as well for added protection.

Mr. Anderson reported that it is anticipated that the Governor will adopt and sign the budget later this week, and details are still emerging, but for now there will be no COLA but also no cuts to LCFF, which amounts to 8 percent more than the amounts used to build this budget. He indicated this will provide short term relief to SJCOE and school districts in the county. He said the cash deferrals is the next big change with funding from February – June being pushed into the 2021 – 2022 year.

Mr. Anderson described two areas requiring attention; one is Teachers College of San Joaquin that shows a decreased ending balance due to 30 percent less enrollment in 2020 – 2021 and deficit spending. He said if these numbers truly materialize, there is time to work through the issue thoughtfully and improve the numbers. Venture Academy is also experiencing deficit spending due to LCFF projections. Mr. Anderson, along with Assistant Superintendent Janine Kaeslin, will work with Venture to monitor and revise the budget as necessary.

In terms of Special Education, Mr. Anderson reported an increase in the base funding of \$68 per ADA ongoing and also \$5 million for low incidence cases. Another helpful measure is Federal funding through the CARE Act, which will be allocated to schools proportionate to their Title I funds. Additional CARE Act funding for learning loss mitigation is also available with some flexibility for its utilization.

Mr. Anderson explained that schools and county offices of education ADA will be held harmless at 2019 – 2020 levels, which is important as attendance for the next school year may be erratic.

Board members asked questions regarding Venture Academy's enrollment, whether ADA will be reported even though the funding will be paid at the 2019 - 2020 rate, the plans for reopening SJCOE schools and local school districts, transportation of students when schools reopen, and whether reductions in staff were on the horizon.

The Board commended Mr. Anderson and his staff for their efforts and attention to the finances of SJCOE, as well as the school districts in the county. There were no further comments. The public hearing was closed.
