I. CALL TO ORDER:

President Gebhardt called the meeting to order at 12:00 p.m. Board member Vogel led the Pledge of Allegiance.

- II. ADDITIONS TO THE AGENDA: There were no additions to the agenda.
- III. COMMENTS: There were no comments from the audience.

## IV. ITEMS SCHEDULED FOR INFORMATION:

- Credential Application Annual Report: Chief Human Resources Officer Christina Torres-Peters reviewed the annual Credential Application Report that illustrates the number of credential applications processed by the San Joaquin County Office of Education during the 2021 – 2022 school year, including temporary teaching certificate applications. Ms. Torres-Peters reported a total of 515 credential applications were processed, 21 of which were renewal applications. In terms of temporary county certificates, a total of 732 applications were processed, which includes 78 for San Joaquin County Office of Education employees.
- 2. Declaration of Need: Chief Human Resources Officer Christina Torres-Peters presented the Declaration of Need for Fully Qualified Educators report and explained that actual needs and projected enrollment for the coming year indicate the area of anticipated need for emergency permits includes Cross-cultural, Language, and Academic Development (CLAD) and English Learning Authorization in the San Joaquin County Alternative Education and Special Education programs. The estimated number of limited assignment permits includes 5 Multiple Subject credentials, 30 Single Subject credentials, and 20 credentials in the area of Special Education.

Participation in a commission-approved university internship program, as well as programs provided by Teachers College of San Joaquin, serve as evidence of efforts to certify, assign, and develop fully qualified teaching staff. County Superintendent Brown certified this report, which will remain in effect until June 30, 2023.

 Summary of Support for Districts: Division Director of Continuous Improvement and Support Lauren Dinubilo presented the San Joaquin County Office of Education Summary Report for 2022 – 2023. Ms. Dinubilo explained that this report outlines the plan to support the implementation and approval of Local Control and Accountability Plans, as well as the utilization of the cycle of continuous improvement to provide technical assistance based on needs that adhere to the provisions of Education Code §§ 52070 and 52071. Ms. Dinubilo reviewed the objectives, indicators, and actions that would provide these services, along with the collaboration efforts and the budget that supports the plan.

Local Indicator Report: County Operated Schools and Programs Division Director Melanie 4. Greene reviewed the San Joaquin County Office of Education Local Indicator Report. Ms. Greene described the priorities based on performance standards which include an analysis of the level of appropriately assigned teachers, access to curriculum-aligned instructional materials, and safe, clean, and functional school facilities; the progress on the implementation of State Academic Standards; the inclusion of input from parents in decision making and the promotion of parent participation in programs; the analysis of the school climate, which includes the perception of school safety and connectedness; a review of the extent of student access and enrollment in a broad course of study; an assessment of the level of progress in the coordination on instruction for expelled youth; and the coordination of services for Foster Youth.
